Hallelujah as new organ is completed

MAGNIFICENT music can now be heard in a church once again after its eye-catching new organ was installed following a devastating fire.

The organ, which has taken around two years to complete, has been built in Cranbourne's St Peter's Church to replace the Father Willis organ which was damaged in an arson attack in January 2006.

Churchwarden Diane Clemison said: "The organ, which was nearly 150 years old, took the main brunt of the fire and so was completely obliterated.

"We had to make a huge decision in regards to what we should do with the organ and decided to install a completely new model."

As well as damaging the organ, the whole of the Hatchet Lane church was smoke and water damaged, and a number of pews, bibles, books and pictures were destroyed in the fire.

Extensive work had to be carried out on the Reredos, gilt-edged wall pictures behind the altar, and restoration was needed on internal stonework, floors, ceiling rafters and tiles.

It cost 51m of insurance payments to restore the church, plus a further 540,000 raised through events such as auctions, concerts and sponsored walks.

Philip Wharton, an organ consultant, said: "There are very few churches around that have the opportunity to get a brand new organ. It's very rare. In

my opinion it has put Cranbourne on the map. The previous organ had plain pipes but this one is multi-coloured and much bigger in size.

"Every little part of the organ, which cost around 5200,000, is made individually by hand and there is just short of 1,500 pipes in the organ altogether."

Mike Thomas, minister at the church, which was built in 1854, said the look and sound of the organ has given the church the wow factor.

He said: "We are so proud to have a restored church and especially to have a brand new organ.

"To be standing here now is just fantastic compared to the shock of see-

ing the church in its former damaged state."

To celebrate the completion of the organ, the church is hosting an open event on Saturday at 4pm, where the organ builder, Peter Collins, will be on hand to talk about its design and construction.

Mrs Clemison added: "We want to have the church filled with people and music.

"With the arrival of the organ, the redecoration of the church is finished, and we are very proud of how it looks now."
